

OPTIMISATIONS FOR PARIS 2024

$$\overline{OOO}$$

Optimised venue master plan with 95% venues existing or temporary

Training venue operational periods re-assessed and aligned with, Olympic village opening and athlete arrival patterns

Testing programme based on risk analysis allows for a 40% reduction of events & operations

IF Delegation confirmed – overall number of technical officials reduced by over 500

Look of the Games, in particular on and around the Field of Play and sport equipment, will be protected as a priority and will not be negatively impacted by the optimisation exercise

From Paris 2024 onwards, Sport Entries will be owned and managed by the IOC in collaboration with the OCOGs.

LA28 SPORT PROGRAMME

Background

December 2021, the IOC EB approved a new intermediate step to finalise each of the sport's disciplines for LA28.

Joint commitment of IOC and LA28 to reduce the cost and complexity of hosting the Games while ensuring the most compelling sports programme for the Olympic movement.

The adjusted timeline will provide early certainty to athletes, NOCs, and IFs and OCOG's.

The process has enabled the most comprehensive data collection on the Olympic Programme.



THE CHALLENGE



Increasing number of cases reported to NOCs, IFs and IOC

Cases must be addressed on local level

Request from Olympic Movement stakeholders for IOC leadership



THE GOALS



Strengthened support to athletes (prevention, response)

Support to IFs and NOCs through stronger local systems

Strong, independent national structures, supported through regional networks

Build on existing IOC programme



DECISION

USD 10M fund per Olympiad to strengthen safeguarding prevention and response at the local level.

Establishment of an IOC-led safeguarding working group chaired by HRH Prince Feisal al Hussein, which includes IF and NOC representatives.


Mandate: To consider the best approach to establishing independent safeguarding systems and structures at the local national level.

Timeline: April – October 2023

REFUGEE ATHLETE PARTICIPATION

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR INTERNATIONAL FEDERATION STATUTE CHANGES

ELIGIBILITY

Athletes must be recognized as refugees or beneficiaries of international protection according to UNHCR. Athletes may enter IF events subject to positive assessment of their respective <u>host country</u> National Federation and/or NOC

NAME OF THE TEAM

Use of the IF acronym followed by "Refugee Team". Ex : UCI Refugee Team - URT

FLAG

Use of the official flag of the IF as the flag of the Refugee Team

ANTHEM

If applicable, use of the IF anthem. If not possible, suggestion to use the short version of the Olympic Anthem.


