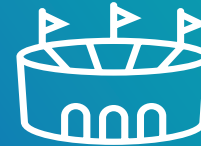

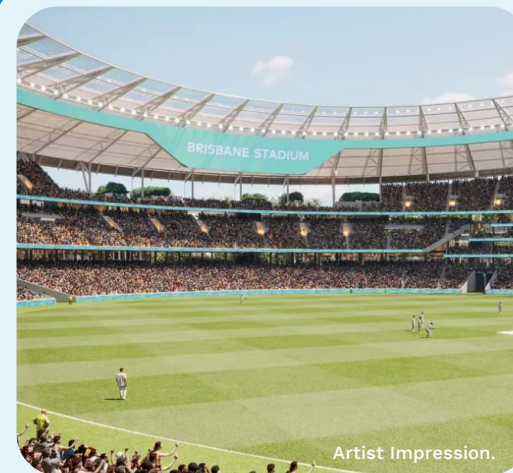

2032 Delivery Plan

- Queensland Government's 2032 Delivery Plan announced in March 2025
- Delivery of 17 new and upgraded venues
- \$7.1 billion (AUD) committed by Commonwealth and State Government's
- Games Independent Infrastructure and Coordination Authority (GIICA) leads project delivery
- Investment framework includes delivery of a Project Validation Report (PVR) for each project
- PVR addresses cost, legacy and Games requirements and unlocks funding
- Brisbane 2032 is coordinating IF input for relevant projects

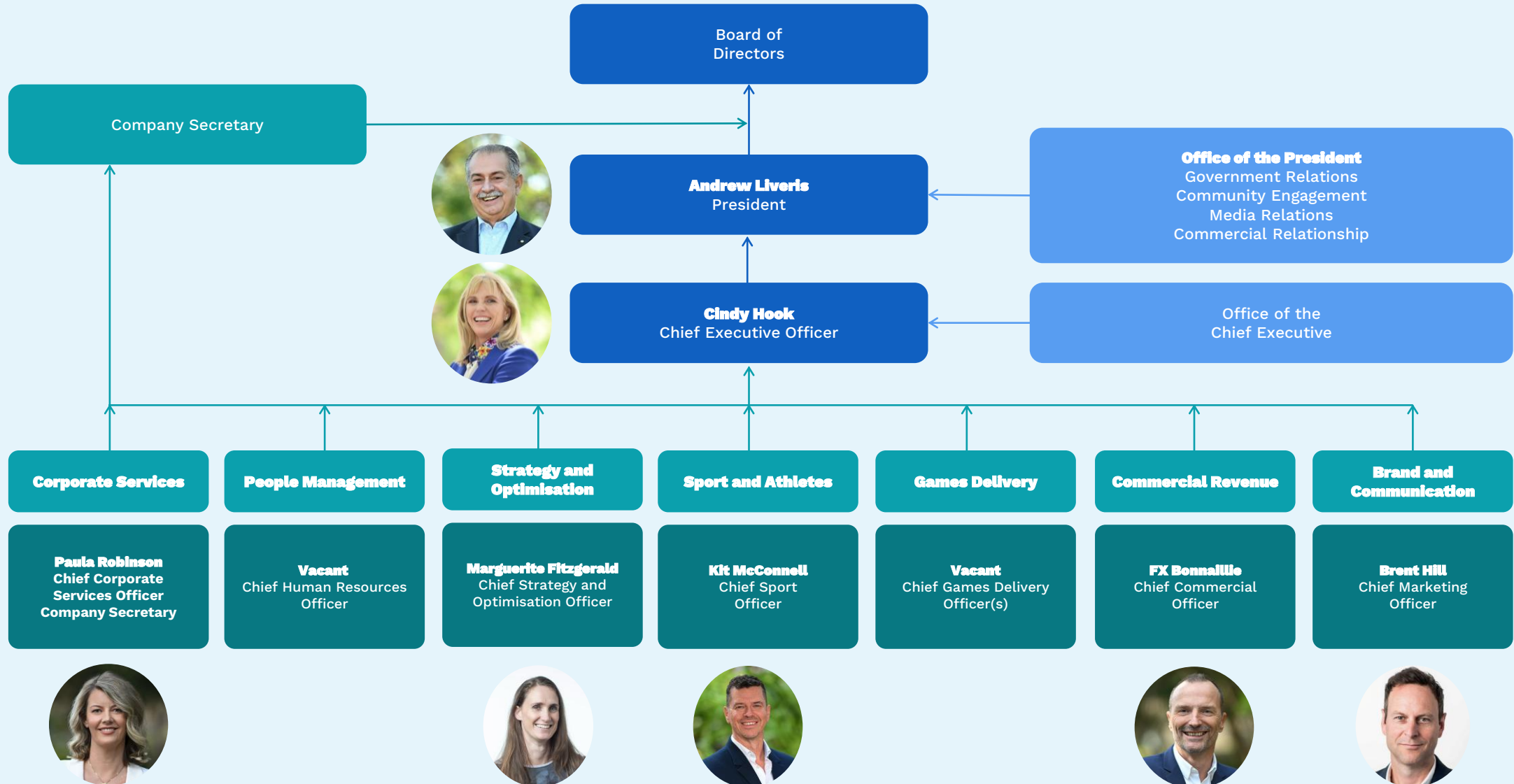

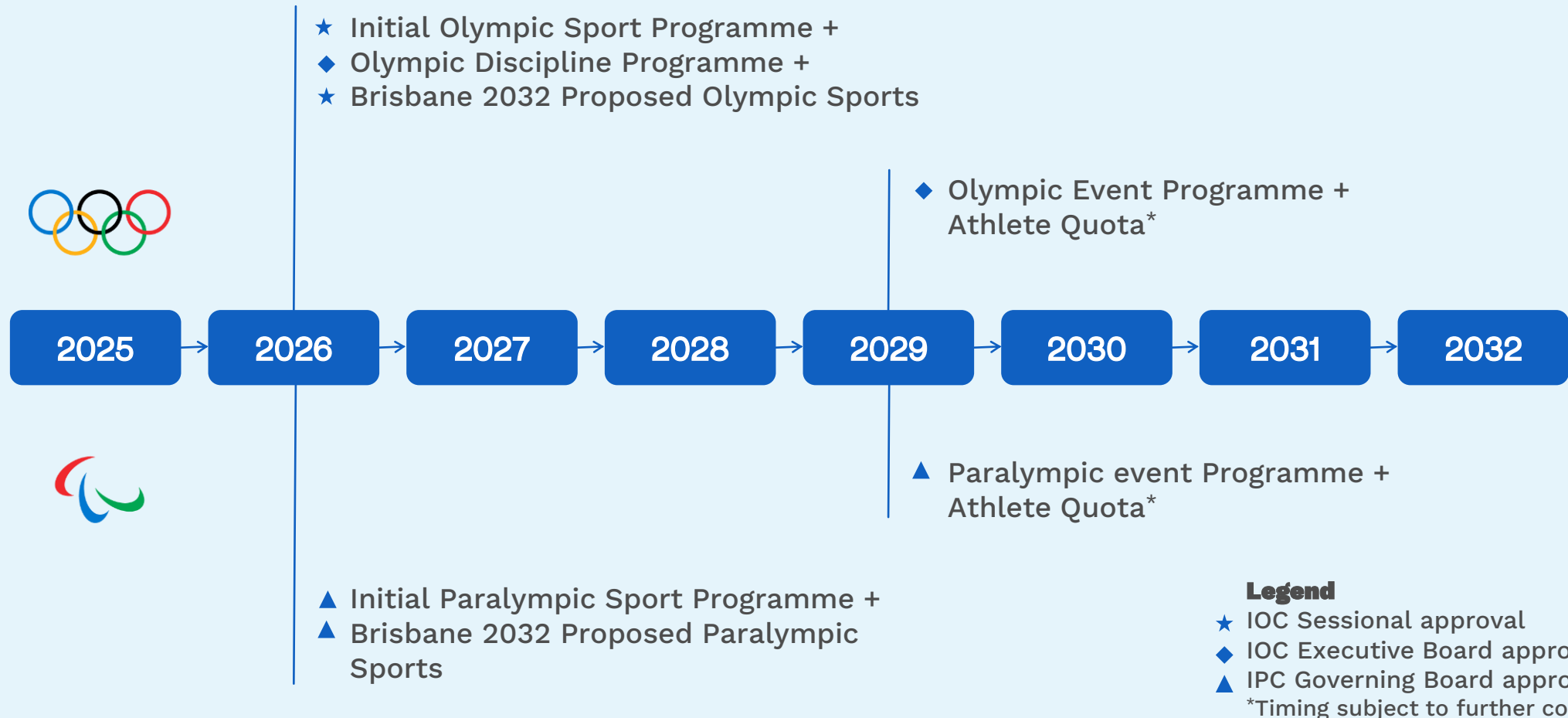

Current Priorities

✓	Engagement with IOC on Fit for the Future process and Sport Programme development
✓	Progressing detailed analysis of potential additional sports
✓	Coordinating IF input into venue design processes
✓	IF engagement via existing forums and events (e.g. Milano Cortina 2026, IF Forum)
✓	Maximising the opportunities of a Home Games for the Oceania region working group
✓	Structured athlete engagement through the Athlete and Sport Advisory Group (ASAG)
✓	Measured approach to NOC and NPC engagement, strong interface with IOC, IPC, AOC and PA

Brisbane 2032 Sport Programme - Current Timeline



IF Engagement

- First 'Brisbane 2032 Snapshot' issued in December 2025 (twice yearly IF Newsletter)
- Structured engagement underway to coordinate IF input into PVR processes
- Maximising IF engagement via existing forums and events (e.g. Milano Cortina 2026, ASOIF GA, IF Forum)
- Utilise 'Green and Gold Runway' to conduct targeted engagement
- IF Visit Policy to be developed in 2026
- NF engagement via AOC, PA and existing forums
- Key engagement topics: Oceania, future event opportunities, legacy and impact programmes
- Regular IF planning meetings to be scheduled from early 2027
